LANDULPH PARISH COUNCIL MEETING, 15 JUNE 26

Public Forum

The Tree Warden gave an impassioned plea on behalf of a number of parishioners about hedge cutting on Highdown. Disturbing nests during nesting season is a criminal act, and there should have been a nest check carried out and recorded beforehand. It is understood that cutting is done for safety but only the sightline should have been cut. She also challenged the assumption that most parishioners support cutting. (Note the PC had one very complimentary message about the hedge cutting.)

Minutes – Matters Arising

Councillor Gawith was investigating the legal ownership of the Memorial Hall. People think that the PC is a custodian trustee, but this is not supported by the Land Registry. The PC should also confirm the legal ownership of the Penyoke field and Searle Family Memorial Field.

Planning.

The Croft at Hatt; Want a Change of Use from pub to nursery/café/restaurant. This is in Hatt parish so of no direct concern to Landulph, but the applicants had not done their research very well. The suggestion that there is a lack of Under-5s provision was patently wrong.

Electrical substation, Elbridge; The synchronous condenser application is currently refused. A similar installation elsewhere has now needed a retrofit of additional soundproofing! The Chair noted that a government paper now calls for mandatory support to local communities as part of any installation.

Payments List.

New format financial report from Scribe was presented live for the first time.

Artificial Intelligence and the PC.

No, not an oxymoron. Current advice is that AI can be used but be aware of the pitfalls. The most likely application is the use of generative AI in public consultations, but councillors should not use free services as this could lead to inadvertent data release. Zoho has some AI functionality which is included in our contract, but the PC needs to update the IT policy.

Public Realm Improvement and Re-introduction of Weed Treatment.

Following the discussion about re-introducing glyphosate, Cornwall Council has now suggested that parishes organise their own 'Parish Pavement Parties' to tackle weeds. Cormac would provide equipment and compost bins; pasties were also mentioned. Such groups would come under the Cormac volunteers scheme, so our Public Rights of Way group would be involved rather than the PC. Councillors were underwhelmed, and some kickback is expected from parishioners who expect something from their taxes.

Separately, Councillor Tagg reported that she had been very impressed by

Cormac recently. They are currently looking at potential projects, and perhaps might look at the emergency access to the village via Tinnel/ Salters Mill.

Governance & Finance Working Group

Report on the website.

Landulph Orchard Group

See report. Some laurel bushes need trimming, but this needs to involve the Tree Warden.

Playing Field Working Group

New fencing now being installed, but there are now comments about the reduced gap between the new fence and the adjacent bushes/wall. This is used by dog walkers to avoid crossing the playing field. Hedge/nettles and rubbish can be cleared to provide a path, but note that this is not a public footpath.

Only one case of dog poo found – well done dog walkers!

Searle Family Memorial Field

Councillor Gawith had visited Hatt's field, and ascertained the cost of grass cutting to feed into coming discussions.

AOB

A parishioner had expressed concern about the hedges along the bottom of Coombe Lane. These are the landowners' responsibility and no action would be taken.

Councillor Cador (Cornwall councillor for Saltash, Tremarton & Landrake) gave a quick update on something. There seems to be a move to repaint all the white lines on county roads, and the budget has increased 6-fold.

LANDULPH PARISH COUNCIL MEETING, 20 JULY 26

Minutes – Matters Arising

The contractor has confirmed in writing that a nest survey took place before hedge cutting.

Planning.

Methodist Church; Two councillors had visited and commended the owners on saving a historic community building. This application is for Listed Building Consent, not final planning and is submitted to allow weather-proofing of the structure to start. Councillors were confused - they felt the application should cover all aspects related to listing. For example, a wind turbine was mentioned but did not appear in the document. Councillors presume missing items will be covered in the full application. Note that parts of the organ had been taken away – it had become the original organ donor. Supported.

‘Newlyn’, Church Lane; Non-material amendment to some doors/windows. Supported.

Land adjacent to Tregwheal; Mr Jason Reep (Superfit builders) applied to build a family home on what used to be the garden of Tregwheal. This arrived that morning, and councillors were generally supportive, but Standing Orders require applications to be available 3 days beforehand. Councillors could therefore discuss but not decide. Next PC meeting is September; Councillors agreed on a delegated decision.

Memorial Hall.

The original pitch-fibre sewer pipes have reached end of life and are collapsing. Emergency repairs were carried out last year, but more now need doing. It is not clear whether the PC (freeholder of the site), has responsibility for drains or whether the hall committee (as leaseholders) are responsible. To be discussed further in closed session. The outcome may be influenced by the ‘Resilience Hub’ strategic plan – to be discussed at the hall committee meeting 4 August.

NPS – Neighbourhood Priorities Statement.

Big changes to the planning system are imminent. The Tamar Development Plan will cover the entire river area including dockyards, businesses, transport etc. Local input will be through an NPS, feeding into the Cornwall Local Plan. The NPS should be a simple document covering housing needs, development locations, infrastructure and environmental protection. Councillors to submit a ‘designation request’ for designation of a neighbourhood area, then form a working group (ideally led by a parishioner).

Digital Archive.

The service provider for Landulph.org backs up data on the website. If anything is inadvertently deleted from the website, it would be permanently lost. Zoho could be used as a permanent backup, but this was not publicly available. Councillor Tagg will use Zoho, but will ensure items of interest are also placed on the PC’s website.

Governance & Finance Working Group

Recommendations; Not all councillors need access to bank accounts; bank statements to be held on Zoho; Clerk to make necessary payments during the summer break; accept the AI policy (on the PC’s website) but ensure there is always a human in the loop; finally create a procedure for 3rd party requests to use PC assets.

£5k allocated to Cormac for the Highdown layby has not been claimed. Councillor Worth will ask if we could reallocate it.

Landulph Climate Group

The school’s visit to Duchess Green had been a resounding success.

Landulph Orchard Group

Thanks passed to Gwerie Morris for her efforts. LOG is applying for an accessibility grant to open an existing gateway at the top of the church parking layby, allowing easier access to Duke. Terms from the Duchy limit how local organisations can use the greens. Local groups need to liaise with the working group, consider a donation to LOG funds and ensure access is left open for locals.

Playing Field Working Group

New fencing now installed. The cost increased slightly but was still within budget. Thanks to Councillor P Braund for his efforts.

Searle Family Memorial Field

None of the sporting clubs contacted had responded. PC will now explore alternative long-term options. A woodland for recreational use was allowed by the bequest conditions. Councillor Morris will arrange a visit by Forests for Cornwall. The water supply to be cut off.

Other.

Councillor Gawith is acquiring Land Registry details for the playing field and Searle Memorial Field. Should this include the ownership of the Landulph Cross corner?

DUCHESS GREEN EVENTS

At the end of June, 67 members of the Rock Choir entertained an audience of about 140 in Duchess Green (see front cover picture). Members of the audience selected the songs (by choosing a number between 1 and 50) and for each one the choir produced a lovely performance without notes and in one case without the conductor! It was obvious the choir enjoyed themselves as much as the audience: *'The setting was truly beautiful, and it was a joy for our choir members to sing in such a warm and welcoming atmosphere.'*

The evening was definitely enhanced by Jason's Festival Bar and the Saltash Tamar Lions BBQ. The new turning circle allowed Saltash Red Bus (thanks Ben the driver) to run a shuttle from the Cargreen, the amphitheatre provided a lovely audience space (thanks LOG for cutting the grass) and even the weather was kind.

At the beginning of July, all 55 children from Landulph School with their teachers visited Duchess Green for an afternoon of Citizen Science. The

children looked at the bugs to be found in the pond, showed their prowess navigating with a compass, investigated the quickest way up the mound, drew the plants and insects in the grassland, measured their Miyawaki trees and explored the different



habitats in Duchess Green. Amazingly, one of the Miyawaki Alder trees had grown 48cm in the 2 months since our audit. They also took photos for the wildlife competition running until 12 September. The children were a credit to the school and with the nine volunteers enjoyed the activities. The next event is Sketching Summer on Saturday 1 August which includes Duchess Green in a trail of four beautiful vantage points. There will be refreshments from 12:00 and music in the afternoon. All welcome, whether you want to draw, paint or just be inspired.

On Tuesday 18 August from 2-4pm there will be an opportunity to help look after Landulph Orchard Green – these events are always good fun (plenty of chatter and cake) – and don't require too much skill or energy. Duke Orchard and Duchess Green are open all the time for everyone to enjoy – we hope you'll visit during the summer. For more information, see www.landulph.org.

MOORHENS AND DRAGONFLIES

This year we have been fortunate enough to have a pair of moorhens on the pond in Duchess Green. The first clutch of eggs was in a nest somewhere on the island so we had rare sightings of the chicks but three juveniles have regularly been seen. The parents are black with white flashes, have a red beak with a yellow tip while the juveniles are dusty brown with brown beaks. Unlike coots, moorhens have chicken-like legs and feet which allows them to run over the floating weed on the pond – they are sometimes called marsh hens.

The second nest was on the grass in the pond near the bridge so we were lucky enough to see the balls of black fluff with tiny red beaks emerging from the eggs. Four chicks hatched and as they are precocial (relatively mature at birth), they soon started to swim and explore their surroundings. As the chicks developed both the juveniles and parents could be seen feeding them. We have captured some footage using the wildlife camera and have recently started a youtube channel (<https://www.youtube.com/@landulphorg>).

The dragonflies and damselflies on the pond in Duchess Green are being monitored by the British Dragonfly Society. A damselfly's body is delicate and small, the flight is weak and damselflies usually rest with wings together; in contrast a dragonfly's body is large and robust, the eyes are large and dragonflies tend to rest with their wings open. The recorder we met on 15 June, has recorded the following:

- damselflies: common blue, azure, large red (see picture), blue tailed
- dragonflies: broad-bodied chaser, common red darter, emperor

He has taken some wonderful photos which we are allowed to display with thanks to the British Dragonfly Society.

In addition, the website includes details of local events, information about local groups and all back issues of the newsletters.

If you have difficulty finding where to look here are some tips:

- The layout of the website is different on a desktop computer or a mobile; on a desktop the various sections or chapters are found along the top and very bottom of every page, on a mobile all the chapters are listed at the bottom of the page using **Menu**
- **Home** at the top always takes you back to the home or starting page
- On the home page the link **What's on this month** shows events
- On the home page under 'Latest Articles' the link **View full news item** shows links to all the articles added in the last two months

We occasionally introduce a favourite recipe from one of our Parisioners. You will see below a Chocolate chip cookie recipe from Sioux Colver, Stockadon Barns

CHOCOLATE CHIP COOKIES

You will need two large baking trays, wooden spoon, greaseproof paper, bowl and saucepan.

Ingredients

220g salted butter (soft)

110g caster sugar

275g plain flour

Approximately ½ block of Waitrose

Cooks' ingredients Belgian Dark

Chocolate for cooking. You may need

to use more depending on how many biscuits you make.

Approximately ½ pack of Dr Oetker dark Chocolate chunks or as many as you wish to add in.

Method

1. Cream the butter and sugar together with a wooden spoon adding some chocolate chunks as you mix. Then sieve in the flour a couple of tablespoons at a time whilst continuing to mix and adding the rest of the chocolate chunks making sure there are plenty spread throughout the mixture. Finish off by bringing the mixture together with your hands into one large ball and then take small lumps (usually makes around 20-24) and roll in your hands to shape them into golf ball size balls pressing them down slightly as you place them on the baking tray.

2. Bake them for about 7-10 minutes in a fan oven at 180° (or equivalent) until slightly golden.

3. Remove from the oven and using a metal spatula carefully take each one off the tray (they will still be soft) and place on a wire rack and leave until they are cool.

4. While they are cooling break the dark chocolate slab into squares and place in a bowl over a saucepan of boiling water to melt.

5. Once the biscuits are cool dip them into the chocolate and I use a teaspoon just to make sure the edges are covered. Place them back on the baking tray lined with greaseproof paper and put them in the fridge to allow the chocolate to harden.

You can also use white or milk chocolate according to your taste.

DEFIBRILLATOR AT STOCKADON BARN

The distance to travel to access a defibrillator from Stockadon Barns is too far when urgency is of the essence. Funding was refused by the Parish Council and no other contributions were offered. In order to address this issue the five residents pay for solely and maintain a defibrillator at the barns. However, anyone having need to use it in an emergency is welcome to do so. The defibrillator is situated at the side of the end garage on the left over the cattle grid. There is a green sign indicating the location and the cabinet is always left unlocked and ready to use with all the instructions for use inside. Please note there are no paediatric pads on the unit. The defibrillator is registered with the national defibrillator network which gives the availability of defibrillators throughout the country (<https://thecircuit.uk>)

Life Saving Automatic Defibrillators

There are two defibrillators located within our parish, both for public use in an emergency.

1. Landulph Memorial Hall in Fore Street
2. Cargreen Yacht Club, Coombe Lane.

Landulph Memorial Hall defibrillator:

Located adjacent to front doors

To use you are required to input the code 1111 to unlock, and press the green 'tick' button to open for access.

Cargreen Yacht Club defibrillator

Located on the front wall of the building before you reach the front doors.

This unit is left unlocked, and so no unlock code is required.

Please remember in the event that you may need to use one of the above units, that in a cardiac arrest situation: **continuous CPR is essential while someone else goes to obtain the defibrillator.**
